BOIL YOUR WATER BEFORE USING

Southwest Warren County Municipal Authority **May Be At Increased Risk From Microbial Contamination.**

We routinely monitor the conditions in the distribution system. On 03/18/26, we experienced a **potential** loss of positive water pressure due to a low water storage tank. A loss of positive water pressure is a signal of the existence of conditions that could allow contamination to enter the distribution system through back-flow by back-pressure or back-siphonage. As a result, there is an increased chance that the water may contain disease-causing organisms.

What should I do?

DO NOT DRINK THE WATER WITHOUT BOILING IT FIRST. Bring all water to a rolling boil, let it boil for one minute, and let it cool before using; or use bottled water. You should use boiled or bottled water for drinking, making ice, washing dishes, brushing teeth, and food preparation until further notice.

Inadequately treated water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms include bacteria, viruses, and parasites, which can cause symptoms such as nausea, cramps, diarrhea, and associated headaches.

These symptoms, however, are not caused only by organisms in drinking water, but also by other factors. If you experience any of these symptoms and they persist, you may want to seek medical advice.

Guardians of infants and young children and people at increased risk, such as pregnant women, some of the elderly, and people with severely compromised immune systems, should seek advice from their health care advisors about drinking this water. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from EPA's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1 (800) 426-4791.

What happened? What is being done?

Sections of water system may experience a loss of pressure. This loss of pressure is due to the low water storage tank level and system leaks. This may cause a loss of pressure and could cause a high turbidity (Cloudy) in the water. The authority is working to locate system leaks and doing filter maintenance to return the tank to its normal level. This boil water notice is in effect until further notice. Once the repairs are complete and water quality testing is done the boil water notice will be lifted. Once lifted you will be notified.

We will inform you when all corrective actions have been completed and when you no longer need to boil your water.
